DEATH OF MRS. MAYO. – We regret to announce the death, on Thursday, after a short illness, of Mrs. Mayo, wife of Dr. Mayo, the eminent physician, who was for some time president of the Royal College of Physicians, and widow of the late Sir. William Symonds, for many years Surveyor of the Navy. The deceased lady was highly esteemed for her amiability and kindness to the poor. The mansion called “The Refuge,” where she died, as well as the valuable grounds in connection with it, and comprising a good portion of the town, now revert, we understand, to Admiral Sir T. M. Symonds, now commanding the Channel Fleet, who was the only son of Sir W. Symonds by his first wife.
