**DEATH OF MR. C. W. MEW.** – The death took place at 55 Sea-street on Friday week of Mr. Charles William Mew, a familiar figure to frequenters of the quayside, where he was employed by the Corporation in connection with the quay extension works, and in making concrete blocks for the Council houses, &c. Mr. Mew, who was 44, served as a gunner in the R.G.A, during the war. He was an excellent workman, and was greatly liked among his workmates on account of his genial good-natured disposition. He had lately started in business as a travelling greengrocer. He leaves a widow. The funeral took place at the Parish Church, Canon C. H. Thompson, R.D., officiating. Those attending, in addition to the family mourners, included the Mayor (Mr. W. Blake), Capt. P. E. Shields, M.C. (borough accountant), Mr. M. J. Attrill, and Mr. G. Snow, J.P. The interment was at Newport Cemetery, and there were a large number of floral tributes.
