## DEATH OF MR. WALTER MINNS.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. Walter Minns, of Newport, which took place last evening after a very brief illness. The deceased gentleman, who was the younger brother of Captain and Quarter-master Minns, Isle of Wight Rifle Volunteers, and Mr. Charles Minns, the resident engineer of the Merston and St. Lawrence Railway works, had spent many years abroad as a marine engineer, and only returned to his native town a few years since to carry on, in conjunction with Mr. J.W. Way, the engineering works established by the late Mr. B. Urry. During his residence in Newport, Mr. Walter Minns has won the sincere regard of all with whom he has come in contact. He was a man of fine physique and apparently robust health. He was seized with internal hemorrhage on Tuesday evening, and sank under the attack, as stated, within three days. He leaves a widow and young family, who have the sincerest sympathy of this community.
