NEWPORT.

THE LATE MR. EDMUND MORRIS. – The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon of the late Mr. Edmund Morris, of Hearn-street, whose death on the previous Friday, at the age of 79, was briefly recorded in our last issue. The late Mr. Morris, familiar as a cabinet-maker and upholsterer, was one of the oldest and most respected tradesman of the town, and for some time had had the distinction of being the member who had been enrolled longest on the books of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, his membership extending over half a century. The first part of the funeral service took place at the Parish-church, the Vicar officiating, assisted by the Rev. F. S. Sansom (curate of St. John's), and the interment was at Newport Cemetery. The numerous relatives included deceased's sons, Mr. Edward Morris and Mr. W.H. Morris, and in addition there were present Mt. F.G. Cooper, Messrs. Tucker and Warren (managers in the employ of Mr. Edward Morris), and a number of members of Oddfellows, including Bros. G. Hoad, N.G., W. Wickens, J.C. Millgate, T.H. Walden (lecture master), W. Fuller, and Wiseman. There were a number of beautiful floral tributes. The Oddfellows' service was impressively read at the grave by Bro. Walden.
