NEWPORT.

Death of Mr. W. H. Morris. – The death occurred on Thursday week of Mr. William Henry Morris, of 13 Mill-street, at the advanced age of 83. He was a brother of the late Mr. Edward Morris, J.P., the proprietor of the Emor Furnishing Stores, and worked for him for many years as an upholsterer. Late he was in business on his own account, but had retired for some years. His first wife died in 1903. The funeral service took place on Sunday in the Parish Church, the Vicar (Canon W.B. Hogg) officiating. Deceased was buried in Newport Cemetery in the grave of his first wife, who was the daughter of Sergt.-major Cooper. The mourners were Mr. F. Morris (son), Miss Morris (daughter). Mr. Spencer, R.N., and Mrs. Spencer (daughter and son-in-law), the Misses Ruth and Mary Spencer (grand-daughters), Mrs. Lamsley and Mrs. Stewart (nieces), Mr. and Mrs. Harold Gray (nephew), Mr. and Mrs. Harold Morris (nephew) and Miss Morris, Mr. A.G.O.
