#### NEWPORT.

SUDDEN DEATH. – Mr. C. Morris, tailor, Town-lane, died very suddenly on Saturday last, about noon. He had been for about 40 years in the employ of Messrs. Meager, outfitters, of Newport, and he was busily pursuing his calling when he was stricken by death. The deceased was an active member of the Conservative party, and on the Monday previous to his death he attended the Registration Court and gave evidence in an important case heard on that occasion. He was at the Conservative meeting on Thursday evening, and so late as 10 o'clock on Friday night – within 14 hours of his death – he was actively engaged upon matters relating to the candidature of Colonel Twyford.
