SUDDEN DEATH. – The death occurred with painful suddenness on Thursday evening of Mrs. N.H.T. Mursell, the wife of the well-know host of the Castle Inn, at the age of 47. The deceased, who had been in indifferent health and had been medically attended for heart trouble, experienced a seizure after having attended to customers, and though receiving prompt medical attention she never rallied. Deceased was well-known by a wide circle of friends, who feel much sympathy with Mr. Mursell and his children in their sad bereavement.

FUNERAL OF MRS. N.H.T. MURSELL. – The funeral of Mrs. Mursell, wife of Mr. N.H.T. Mursell, of the Castle Inn, took place on Monday afternoon, the first part of the service being at St. Thomas's Church and the interment at Newport Cemetery. There were signs of mourning at private houses and business premises in the neighbourhood of The Castle. The principal mourners were the husband, two sons, and daughter, father, mother, and brother, Mr. T. Mursell, Mrs. Dingle, Mr. G. Moyce, Mr. and Mrs. H. Westmore, Mr. W. Tarrant, Mr. J. Walker and Mr. Evans. There were also representatives of Carisbrooke Bowling Club and of the Newport Fire Brigade, of both of which Mr. Mursell is captain, and many personal friends, the Deputy-Captain of the Fire Brigade (Mr. A. Whittington) and hon. secretary of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club (Mr. H. Daish) being among them. The Vicar (Rev. H. Edmund Sharpe) officiated.
