NEWPORT.

The DEATH – of Mr. Harry Peach, aged 59, which occurred on Tuesday at Peach's Temperance Hotel, Pyle-street, removes a member of one of the oldest and most respected Newport families. The deceased, who had been ill for 15 months, leaves a widow and daughter, for whom much sympathy is felt. He was the youngest son of the late Mr. Jacob Peach, who established the well-known farriery business with which the deceased was connected. Mr. Peach was the youngest member of the Hand-in-Hand Club, formerly held at the Wheatsheaf Hotel, at the time when the society was disbanded. The first part of the funeral service was held at the Parish Church yesterday (Friday), the Rev. E. B. Maynard officiating, the interment following at Newport Cemetery. The mourners were Mrs. Peach (widow), Miss Peach (daughter), Mrs. Newbery (sister), Messrs. T. and F. Peach (brothers), J. Vincent, Salisbury (brother-in-law), A. Salter, and W. Round (nephews), F. Morgan, R. White (Yarmouth), W.D.W. Buckell, Coombes (Sandown). and Creeth (Nettlestone). The funeral arrangements were efficiently carried out by Messrs. H. and F. Damp.
