DEATH OF MR. GEORGE PERKINS. – The death took place on Sunday morning, at the age of 73, of one of the oldest tradesman of the town, in the person of Mr. George Perkins, of Lower High-street, who over half a century ago succeeded the late Mr. Calcutt in the business, which he carried on till his death. The deceased, who was well known and much esteemed, was one of the early Volunteers. In politics he was an ardent Liberal. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon at Newport Cemetery, the Rev. T. Overton (Wesleyan) officiating. The employees and friends of the deceased, in addition to the family mourners, were present at the obsequies, and the floral tributes included a beautiful wreath from the employees.
