THE DEATH - took place on Thursday, after a long and painful illness patiently borne, of Mr. James Reynolds, of Fern Bank, Broadlands, at the advanced age of 96. Deceased, who was a highly-esteemed townsman, was for nearly 30 years the foreman of the building department at the Royal Brewery and for 11 years he was superintendent of the old Borough Fire Brigade, and his estimable qualities won him the warm regard of all who knew him.

THE FUNERAL – of the late Mr. James Reynolds, for nearly 30 years foreman of the building department at the Royal Brewery, took place on Tuesday at Newport Cemetery, the Rev. Arthur Jones (Congregational) officiating. The mourners were Mr. Charles Reynolds (son), James and George (grandsons), Messrs. Robert and Newton Newman, Mr. F. Burden, Mr. F. Morgan, T.C., Mr. Aubrey Lewis (representing Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton, and Co. Ltd.), Mr. F. E. Witcher, T.C., Mr. Edgar Jenkins, Mr. W. H. Tiley, Mr. C. Brown carried out the arrangements. – Mrs. Reynolds and Miss Newman and other relatives desire to express their sincere thanks for the great kindness shown to Mr. Reynolds during his long illness, for the sympathy conveyed to them in their bereavement, and for the beautiful floral tributes.
