# **NEWPORT**

### DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MR. J.H. SHARLAND

It is with regret we have to announce the death, on Sunday, of Mr. J. Hewett Sharland, of Oakholme, Staplers, Newport, who was also well known in Southampton. The deceased had been in feeble health for some time past, so that his death did not come in the nature of a surprise. It is now some years since Mr. Sharland retired from active business pursuits. During his term of residence in Newport he was connected with the Town Council, filling the office of Town Councillor for a period of six years. He also filled the office of overseer for the parish of Newport. Prior to the funeral a short service was held in St. Thomas's Church, Newport, the Vicar (Rev. H.E. Sharpe) officiating, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Lessey [??] and the Rev. Miles Atkinson. The service was choral, the closing hymn being "Peace, perfect Peace." The family mourners were Mrs. Sharland (widow), Miss Sharland (daughter), Mr. Alfred Sharland, of Ryde (brother), Mr. Gerald Duffall, of London; also Mr. W.W. Sharland (Southampton), Mr. Percy Lower (Cardiff) and Mr. Godfrey Egremont (nephews). There were also present Mrs. Alfred Sharland, Mr. and Mrs. Morrice, Mr. and Mrs. Gerrish, Mr. Percy Tary, Mr. Edward Way, and Nurse Harris. Among the congregation in the church who had assembled to pay the last tribute of respect were Mr. R. Roach Pittis, J.P., Major H.J. Way, Dr. Foster, Mr. C.W. Dunlop, Mr. W. Fletcher, of Totland, and Mr. S.D. Pring, etc. As mourners withdrew the organist (Mr. Cushing) played the "Marche Funebre." There were some lovely floral souvenirs, the gifts of sorrowing relatives and friends. That from Mrs. and Miss Sharland took the form of a cross, composed of the choicest white flowers. The inscription read: "In loving memory, from the sorrowing wife of daughter." The deceased was in the 58<sup>th</sup> year of his age.
