FATHER AND CHILD DIE. – The Coroner decided on Saturday that an inquest was unnecessary in the case of the sudden death on the previous day of Maurice, the 11 months old child of Mr. and Mrs. William Squibb, of 10 Crocker-street. The little one had apparently enjoyed good health since birth, but on Thursday was not very well. The next (Friday) morning, after its morning wash, it was, as usual, put to bed about 10.30; but on the mother going upstairs about half an hour later she found the child was dead. At the time of the child's death the father was lying dangerously ill at the Royal I.W. County Hospital, and could not be informed of his little one's death. The father died on Monday. He had been in the Hospital for several months, suffering from kidney disease. The deceased, who was a member of the Sandown Lodge of Oddfellows, came from that town some years ago, and had been in the employ of Messrs. W.B. Mew, Langton and Co. for about 12 years. He leaves a widow and five young children, the eldest twelve years of age, for whom the deepest sympathy is felt in their heavy bereavement.
