FUNERAL OF A VOLUNTEER.-Mr Wm. Stephens, who has been a member of the Newport Volunteers since the commencement of the movement, died on Monday, the 26th ult., after a long illness, and was buried with military honours on Monday last. Capt Francis, Capt Way, and the officers and members of the Newport Rifle Corps, with representatives from other corps, assembled at head-quarters, and headed by the band marched to St. Thomas'-square, the residence of the deceased's parents, and then marched to St. Thomas' Church, where the service was read by the Rev Canon Connor, assisted by the Rev M. Yorke. On leaving the church the procession marched to Newport Cemetery, and in it were the Rev Canon Connor, the Rev M. Yorke, Mr Ald Pinnock, J.P., Mr G. Wyatt, and other members of the Loyal Earl of Yarborough Lodge of Odd Fellows, of which the deceased was a member. Serg-Major Cooper and several other sergeants of the staff of the Isle of Wight Artillery Militia represented the Militia. The band played "The Dead March" in Saul, &c., and the sides of the streets were lined with spectators.
