POSTMAN'S FURNERAL. – The funeral took place at Newport Cemetery on Thursday afternoon of Mr. William Henry Stubbs, one of the younger town postmen, whose death from consumption at the early age of 23 is lamented by those amongst whom he was known and held in high regard. The Vicar (Rev. H. Edmund Sharpe) officiated, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Lessey [??] and those present at the obsequies included the Postmaster (Mr. J. Corfield), Messrs. W.H. Wood (chief clerk), A. Snow, and C.H. Coombes, of the Post-office staff, and a number of postmen. Four of the deceased's colleagues in the postal service, Messrs. W.H. Dore, Odell, Miller, and Ince, acted as bearers. The St. John's Men's Bible Class, of which deceased was a member, was represented by Messrs. J. Dewey (hon. secretary) and C.W. Greenshield (hon. treasurer). There were a number of beautiful floral tributes sent by, among others, the Postmaster, office staff, and postman.
