Farm Managers' Death.— Sincere regret has been expressed at the death, which occurred suddenly on Monday, of Mr. Clive Victor Frank Turner, aged 46, of Buckberry Farm, which he managed for Mr. G. Moody, C.C. He left the house early in the evening to feed his dogs, and as he did not return his wife went to look for him and found him lying dead near the kennels. The facts were reported to the Coroner, who decided to dispense with an inquest. Mr. Turner lived for many years at Pan, where he cultivated a market garden in succession to his father, the late Mr. H. Turner,, and was a well known and popular man. During the war he was a senior warden in the Pan 1 district. The funeral took place on Friday week, a service at St. Paul's Church preceding interment at the Newport Cemetery. The congregation included former A.R.P. personnel and the former district warden (Mr. C. O. Sprake). The mourners were Mrs. Turner (widow), Mr. R. H. W. Turner (brother), Mrs. Alexander and Miss M. Turner (sisters), Mr. A. Morris (brother-in-law), Mr. W. Sanders, Miss N. Sanders (cousins), Mr. A. Chambers, and Miss M. Flux. Floral tributes included those from Mr. and Mrs. G. Moody, his fellow wardens of Pan 1, and neighbours at Buckberry Lane. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements.

His wife and family would like to record their thanks to Dr. McCann, Mr. and Mrs. G. Moody, Mr. Dore, and Mr. Hardy, for their prompt response, kindness, and help, and also to the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley and officials.
