THE LATE MR. H. UNDERWOOD. – On Monday afternoon last the remains of Harry Underwood were committed to their last resting place, by which name he will be remembered by scores of contemporaries, who mourn with his widow and daughters in the great sorrow which has overtaken them. Of a singularly kind, bright, and genial nature, he was always to the front in promoting and assisting everything that conduced to the furtherance of the good old English sports and pastimes. He was, so to speak, one of the fathers of the old Carisbrooke Bowling Club, whose fame and successes are phenomenal, and when the sad news reached the members on the evening of his decease great was their sorrow, and they testified their respect to his memory by sending a magnificent floral emblem, and others did not forget their old comrade. The cortege left the deceased's residence at 2.30, the service at the graveside being conducted by the Rev. W. H. Milward. The mourners were Mrs. Underwood (widow), Mabel and Louie (daughters), Mr. J. Underwood (brother), Mr. Drake (son-in-law), Messrs. F. and J. Billows (brothers-in-law), and amongst others following were Mr. W. J. Whittington, T.C., Mr. N. H. T. Mursell, T.C., Mr. W. H. Wood (Post-office), Mr. George Meech, Mr. R. Roche, and many other friends.
