Sudden Death of Mr. A. C. White. – Mr. Alec Charles White died suddenly on Tuesday at his home, 10 Hearn Street, at the age of 56. Mr. White came here on being transferred from Bournemouth to the local depot of Messrs. Shell-Max and B.P. Ltd., 25 years ago. He was employed by Messrs. Shell-Mex and B.P. for 30 years and recently has worked for their successors, Island Oils, Ltd. A salesman-driver, he won many awards for safe driving. Mr. White was a popular member of the I.W. Angling Society, the East Cowes Sailing Club, and the East Cowes Conservative Club. The evening before he died he was playing darts in a match for the East Cowes Conservative Club team. A post-mortem examination was held and the facts were reported to the Coroner (Mr. J. V. Bullin), who decided that an inquest was not necessary, death being due to natural causes. The funeral service takes place at St. Thomas's Church at 2 p.m. to-day, followed by interment at the Fairlee Road Cemetery.
