DEATH OF MR. JAMES HOBBS. – The death occurred suddenly on Friday evening of last week, of Mr. James Hobbs, 73, of Culver Villa, Staplers, the well-known brick manufacturer, who succeeded to the business carried on at Staplers by his late father. Deceased, who was highly esteemed, had been in failing health for some time, but kept about until the last. The funeral took place at St. Paul's, Barton, on Wednesday, the Rev. J. L. Spratt officiating owing to the indisposition of the Vicar (the Rev. Miles Atkinson). The mourners were Messrs. J. W., George, and Albert Hobbs (sons), Mrs. Gallop, Misses Dorcas and Alice Hobbs (daughters), Mrs. J. W. Hobbs (daughter-in-law), Mr. Gallop (son-in-law), Mr. W. Morris (Pan), and Mr. C. Vincent. There were a number of floral tributes. Messrs. H. and F. Damp carried out the funeral arrangements.
