DEATH OF MR. W. A. MORGAN.----The death occurred yesterday (Friday), at 12 Caesar`s-road, at the early age of 40, of Mr. Wilfred Arnold Morgan, third son of Mr. Thomas Morgan, late of Chillerton. The deceased was a well-known artisan, for many years secretary of the branch of the Carpenters` and Joiners` Union, and during the war was a charge hand at Messrs. S. E. Saunders and Co.`s aviation works at the Folly. He was also a former popular member of the Fire-brigade and the Newport company of Volunteers. He leaves a widow and one child, with whom much sympathy is felt.

THE LATE MR. W. A. MORGAN.----The funeral of Mr. Wilfred Morgan took place on Tuesday, the first part of the service being at the Baptist Church and the interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The Rev. O. Ayres officiated, the hymn "Jesu, Lover of my soul" was sung, and the organist (Mrs. Pilcher) played "O rest in the Lord," and the Dead March in *Saul*. Several members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows to which deceased belonged, attended, including Bros. W. J. Way, N.G., A. Scott, P.P.G.M., and W. Simmance, P.G., whilst some of deceased`s former workmates at Messrs. S. E. Saunders and Co.`s aviation works acted as bearers. The numerous floral tributes included those from the employees of Messrs. S. E. Saunders and Co., and the Newport branch of the Amalgamated Society of Woodworkers, of which the deceased was secretary until a short time ago.----The widow and family wish to thank all friends for their great kindness during his illness, for the many expressions of sympathy, and for the beautiful flowers sent.
