THE LATE MR. U. W. ROLF

The death occurred at St. Mary's Hospital on Tuesday of Mr. Urias William Rolf, aged 74, of 35 Whitesmith Road. Mr. Rolf, who was born in the town, had only been in hospital six days. He had been employed by the G.P.O. most of his life and was connected with the construction of the Niton Wireless Station. When he retired in 1949, as technician number one foreman, he was presented with the Imperial Service Medal and a clock in recognition of 44 years' service. He was later employed at St. Mary's Hospital as a telephone operator, as a driver for the Southern Vectis Omnibus Company, and for seven years by the I.W. Creameries a part-time worker in charge of the canteen. As a young man he was an ardent cycle racing enthusiast and was the Hampshire and I.W. champion on three occasions. He is survived by a widow one son, and three daughters. The funeral takes place to-day, with a service at the Victoria Methodist Church, Pyle Street.
