Mr. George Snow's Bereavement. – The sympathy of his many friends goes out to Mr. George Snow, J.P., C.C., secretary of the Island branch of the National Union of Agricultural Workers and curator of St. Paul's Cemetery, in the death of his wife on Friday week within eight months of the 50th anniversary of their marriage, Mrs. Snow, who was 70 years of age, had been in poor health for some 16 years and bedridden for the last four years. The funeral was on Monday, a service being held in the house and the interment in St. Paul's Cemetery, the Rev. W. P. Jubb, of East Cowes, officiating.

The chief mourners were Mr. Snow (husband), Mr. and Mrs. C., Mr. and Mrs. A., Mr. E., and Mrs. A. Snow (sons and daughters-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. G. Stanbridge and Mr. and Mrs. C. Holbrook (sons-in-law and daughters), Mrs. Whitewood, of Shanklin, and Mrs. F. Sibbeck, of Newport (nieces), Mr. W. Horsford, of Shanklin, nephew), Mrs. Booker, of Godshill, and Mr. A. Dall, of Freshwater (cousins), Mr. F. Sibbeck, and Mr. and Mrs. Westmore (representing the I.W. Isolation Hospital). Two other sons are abroad, Sergt. G. B. Snow, R.E., who is a prisoner in Germany, and Sapper A. Snow, R.E., who is in Burma.

Others present included the Mayor (Ald. W. Blake, J.P.), Ald. W. H. Warrior, J.P., Mr. T. A. Cleaver, Messrs. F. E. Helas (secretary and manager) and E. R. Bearup (Cowes Co-operative Society), Mrs. Appleton and Mrs. Foster.

The numerous floral tributes included those from the chairman and members of the County War Agricultural Executive Committee, of which Mr. Snow is a member; the management committee of the Cowes Co-operative Society; and the staff of the Cowes Co-operative Society.
