**DEATH OF MR. E. F. UPWARD.**— We regret to announce the death of Mr. E. F. Upward, senior partner in the firm of Messrs. W. H. Upward and Sons, printers, which took place on Thursday morning following a long illness at his residence, Broadlands Cottage, Staplers-road, at the early age of 55. He leaves a widow, two sons, and two daughters, with whom deep sympathy is felt in their great loss. The late Mr. Upward was the second son of the late Mr. W. H. Upward, founder of the firm, and he had been engaged in the business throughout his life. His chief hobby was gardening. For many years he was the hon. secretary of the Newport Allotment Holders' Association, which flourished during and for some years after the war, and last year he had the honour of being chairman of the I.W. Horticultural Association. Mr. Upward had been in indifferent health since last April and had been unable to attend to business since November. The funeral service will take place at S. John's Church at 2.30pm on Monday.
