65 Years With One Firm.—Mr. William John Wareham, who died at his home at 71 Crocker Street On Friday week, was employed for 65 years in the wines and spirits department at the Royal Brewery. Starting at the age of 13 in this department he remained there until the time of retirement, owing to ill-health, last year. When he completed 50 years' service with the firm the directors of Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton and Co. presented him with an inscribe clock. Mr. Wareham, who was 78, was at one time a member of the Football Club committee. The funeral was on Tuesday, a service at St, Paul's Cemetery being conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. L. D. Wheatley). The mourners were Mr. E. Wareham (son) Mr. and Mrs. W.
