

## Harry Thomas Dicker

### NEWPORT

A SAD BEREAVEMENT. - The deep sympathy of her numerous friends is extended to Mrs. Dicker, of 28b Fairlee-road (formerly Miss Phyllis Enid Baker, youngest daughter of Mr. W. H. Baker, of Colecroft, Fairlee-road), in the irreparable and unexpected bereavement she suffered by the death, early on Sunday morning, of her husband, Mr. Harry Thomas Dicker, aged 26, a popular employee of the Anglo-American Oil Co. Mr. Dicker was taken ill on Monday December 18<sup>th</sup>, and complications led to his removal to the County Hospital, where an operation was performed on Friday week. This was apparently successful, but unfortunately he succumbed from the shock early on Sunday morning. Mr. and Mrs. Dicker were only married last Easter, and the particularly sad event cast quite a gloom over the Fairlee district during Christmas. The depth of sympathy felt for the young widow was shown by the large attendance and the beautiful display of floral tributes at the funeral at St. Paul's Church on Thursday, at which the Vicar (the Rev. Miles Atkinson) officiated. The chief mourners were Messrs. R. and C. Dicker (brothers), the Misses L. and P. Dicker (sisters), and Messrs. W. H. Baker (father-in-law), C. W., A. E., and L. G. Baker (brothers-in-law), D. Baker (nephew), B. F. Boothby (Island manager of the Anglo-American Oil Co.), and W. J. Eames. The floral tributes included those from the Anglo-American Oil Co., Ltd., the Southern Division of the company, and his colleagues of the Island staff of the company.
