## **NEWPORT**

**Farm Foreman's Suicide** – Yesterday afternoon the Coroner for the Island (Mr. F. A. Joyce) held an inquest at Little Pan Farm, near Newport, on the body of Albert Henry Hembry, aged 41, foreman employed at Little Pan Farm, who committed suicide in very determined manner on the previous evening.

The evidence showed that deceased went indoors about 4:30 on Thursday afternoon, and chatted with his wife for a time and drank a glass of water, and as he left to go out again he said "I shall be in to tea very soon, mother." A little more than half an hour later his body was seen by his young son in the farm pond, to which the son had gone to drive the cows away. The son gave the alarm, and employees and Mr. George Morris went and pulled deceased's body out, but life was extinct. Dr. Underhill, who afterwards examined the body, found a deep wound in deceased's neck, this having been inflicted by a table knife, which was afterwards found bloodstained in the cow stable.

The Coroner said deceased evidently found that death was slow in that way, and he went and threw himself into the pond.

The deceased's wife and employees said deceased had shown no sign of a suicidal tendency, and seemed quite happy in his home and situation, though just lately he had seemed absent-minded and pre-occupied at times.

The jury returned a verdict of "Suicide during temporary insanity," and expressed sympathy with the bereaved family.
