**DEATH OF H. W. NUNN, ESQ.** – Henry William Nunn, Esq., of Broadlands, died yesterday (Tuesday) morning, of congestion of the lungs. The deceased gentleman, who had attained the age of 77 years, was formerly a great employer of labour here in connection with his once celebrated lace manufactory, but he retired from business many years ago, having, it is understood, amassed a large fortune. So long as his health permitted he took an active interest in local affairs. In private life he dispensed his hospitality with a bountiful hand, and many are the records kept in grateful memories of kindly acts done by him in the days of his strength. Of late years his state of health precluded him from society, and the sympathies of all who had the privilege of his friendship were with him during his prolonged seclusion.

**THE WILL OF THE LATE MR. NUNN.** – The will dated May 16, 1868, of Mr. Henry William Nunn, late of Broadlands House, Isle of Wight, who died on February 28<sup>th</sup> last, was proved on the 31<sup>st</sup> ult., by William Major Cooke and Richard Pink, the surviving executors, the personal estate being sworn under £400,000. The testator bequeaths to Mr. Mary Nunn Harvey, the wife of his nephew, Captain Thomas Harvey, £2,000 and all his household furniture and effects, plate, picture, horses, and carriages; to the said Captain Harvey, £2,000; to his nephews, William Henry Nunn, Stephenson Clarke, and Robert John Clarke, £1,000 each; to his godson, Beauclere Beckingsale, and his two executors, £200 each, all free of legacy duty. He devises the manor or lordship of Briddlesford, Isle of Wight, and all the rest of his real estate, and gives the residue of his personal property upon trust to the said Mary Nunn Harvey.
