**DEATH OF MR. JAMES ARNOTT.** – The death took place on Wednesday, at the residence of his step-son, Dr. Milne, F.R.S., of Shide Hill House, of Mr. James Arnott, who had reached the advanced age of 87. The deceased gentleman, who was held in warm regard, was the son of Dr. Arnott, professor of physics and one of the founders of the University of London, to whose scientific knowledge many useful inventions are attributable, among them the well-known Arnott stove. The late Mr. Arnott was a warm supporter of the work of the local Primrose League in past years; he did much earnest work for the Protestant cause as the local secretary of the Church Association; and he was a valued member of the congregation of St. John's Church. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon, at St. Paul's, Barton, the interment being in the Churchyard by the side of his late wife. The Rev. W. H. Nutter officiated. The mourners included Dr. Milne and Dr. Groves, J.P., Mr. and Mrs. Marsh, and there were also present Dr. E. Conyngham Boore, Mr. C. W. Dunlop, Mr. G. H. Duke, and others. At a meeting of the I.W. Photographic Society on Wednesday evening a vote of sympathy was passed with Prof. Milne in his bereavement, in consequence of which the Professor's lecture on "Recent Earthquakes," announced for Thursday evening at the Literary Society, was, of course, postponed.
