## NEWPORT.

SCHOOL TEACHER'S DEATH. - The death occurred on Saturday, after a lingering illness, of Miss Ella Burnett, aged 21, the youngest daughter of Mr. George Burnett, of Lower Highstreet, a promising school teacher. Deceased was a scholar and afterwards for four years a pupil teacher at Barton Council Girls' School, and subsequently an assistant teacher for nearly a year at the National Girl's School, until her health failed. She had also been a valued member of the St. Paul's (Barton) Church choir. Of a kindly and lovable nature she endeared herself to the school children and others with whom she was brought into contact, and her early death is much deplored. The funeral took place on Wednesday afternoon, the first part of the service, which was chorally rendered, being at St. Paul's Church, and the interment took place in the adjoining churchyard. There was a large congregation at the Church, among those present being the Rev. Miles Atkinson (correspondent of the Nationalschools), Mrs. Gould (head-mistress of the girls), and Mrs. Westmore, and scholars of the National Girls'-school, Miss Hinton (Principal of the Pupil Teachers' Centre, at which deceased had been a student), Miss Henshaw (headmistress of the girls), Miss Ford, and Mr. J. L. Mitchell (headmaster of the boys), and other members of the teaching staff of the Barton Council School. The Vicar (Rev. W. H. Nutter) officiated, assisted by the Vicar of Newport (Rev. H. Edmund Sharpe). .... The knells of both St. Thomas's and St. Paul's were tolled. The personal mourners included deceased's father and sister, Mr. and Mrs. Burnett (brother and sister-in-law), Mr. E. Baker (uncle), Mr. H. Baker (cousin), Mr. Young, and Mr. Flux. ....
