FUNERAL OF THE LATE MR DIBBLE. – Our obituary records the demise of Mr Wm. Dibble, of the Royal Brewery Office, at the age of 53. Deceased was highly respected as a man who had gained a good name by well doing his duty in all the relations of life. He formerly belonged to the Inniskilling Dragoons, and served in the Crimean campaign of 1854. The remains were borne to the grave in St. Paul's Cemetery on Tuesday, followed by several warm friends, including his old comrade, Mr J. Hardy, principal warder at Parkhurst Prison, who placed a costly beautiful floral wreath on the coffin.
