Way, wife of the well-known Newport auctioneer, who passed away at the Bays, Staplers, after a lingering illness, on Tuesday. The end was not altogether unexpected, for the deceased lady has been laid aside for several months. Much sympathy is felt with the bereaved husband and his six children, the youngest of whom is barely four years of age. The late Mrs. Way was in the 45th year of her age. The funeral of the deceased took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon in St. Paul's churchyard in the presence of several relatives and friends.

DEATH OF MRS. H. J. WAY. – With regret we have to chronicle the death of Mrs. Henry J. Way, which took place at her residence, The Bays, on Tuesdays last, after a somewhat long illness. The deceased lady was a zealous worker in the parish of St. Paul's, Barton, and she will be truly missed there. She was the president of the mothers' meeting, and at the annual gathering of that body on Wednesday the Vicar (the Rev. W. H. Nutter) gave touching expression to the feeling of sorrow which Mrs. Way's death has called forth. Major Way and his family may be assured that the deepest sympathy of this community is with them in their sorrow. The funeral took place at St. Paul's Churchyard yesterday (Friday), the Vicar (Rev. W. H. Nutter) officiating. The mourners included Major Henry J. Way, Mr. Edward Way (son), Mr. J. E. Milligan (brother), Messrs. C. Clark and C. Way (clerical staff). A number of the mothers' meeting were present in the church and a wreath from them was placed at the head of the grave. A number of exquisite floral tokens were sent by sorrowing relations and friends. The inclemency of the weather prevented the attendance of Ald. W. C. Way, J.P.
