DEATH OF MISS C. ATKINSON

THE LATE MISS C. ATKINSON

The funeral service for Miss Caroline Atkinson, of Switzurhurst, Medina Avenue, took place at St Paul's Church on Tuesday. Canon G.C. Seymour (rector of Calbourne), an associate of the late Rev. Miles Atkinson, officiated, and paid tribute to Miss Atkinson's work in the parishes where her brother had ministered. The Vicar (the Rev. L.J.D. Wheatley) also took part in the service, which included the hymns "Rock of Ages" and "On the Resurrection morning," accompanied at the organ by Mr. L. Dore. The mourners were Miss L. Moody, Mrs. H. Gray, the Misses R. Moody and N. Butcher, Messrs. C.O. Sprake (also representing Mrs. Sumner Wilson and Mr. R. Way) and S.F. Moody (hon. secretary, Parochial Church Council, Mr. R.J. Eldridge (also representing Dr. Sylvester), Mr. G. Hazard (churchwarden at St. Paul's during Mr. Atkinson's incumbency), Mr. F. Chiverton (St. Thomas's Bible Class), and Mesdames Hazard and Wheatley. Several other friends attended. The interment was beside her brother in the churchyard. Messrs. O.C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
